Celebrating The 50th Anniversary Of The Civil Rights Act Of 1964

The saga of the Freedom Riders is an empowering story of courage and commitment. Their courage and sacrifice changed America forever!

Freedom Riders were civil rights activists who rode interstate buses into the segregated southern United States in 1961 and following years to challenge the non-enforcement of the United States Supreme Court decisions Irene Morgan v. Commonwealth of Virginia(1946) and Boynton v. Virginia (1960),^[1] which ruled that segregated public buses were unconstitutional.^[2] The Southern states had ignored the rulings and the federal government did nothing to enforce them. The first Freedom Ride left Washington, D.C., on May 4, 1961,^[3] and was scheduled to arrive in New Orleans on May 17.^[4]

Boynton outlawed racial segregation in the restaurants and waiting rooms in terminals serving buses that crossed state lines. Five years prior to the Boynton ruling, the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC) had issued a ruling in Sarah Keys v. Carolina Coach Company (1955) that had explicitly denounced the Plessy v. Ferguson (1896) doctrine of separate but equal in interstate bus travel. The ICC failed to enforce its ruling, and Jim Crow travel laws remained in force throughout the South.

Police arrested riders for trespassing, unlawful assembly, and violating state and local Jim Crow laws, along with other alleged offenses, but they often first let white mobs attack them without intervention.

The Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) sponsored most of the subsequent Freedom Rides, but some were also organized by the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). The Freedom Rides followed dramatic sit-ins against segregated lunch counters, conducted by students and youth throughout the South, and boycotts of retail establishments that maintained segregated facilities, beginning in 1960.

The Freedom Riders established great credibility with blacks and whites throughout the United States and inspired many persons to engage in direct action for civil rights. Perhaps most significantly, the actions of the Freedom Riders from the North, who faced danger on behalf of southern blacks, impressed and inspired the many blacks living in rural areas throughout the South. They formed the backbone of the wider civil rights movement, who engaged in voter registration and other activities. Southern blacks generally organized around their churches, the center of their communities and a base of moral strength.

The Freedom Riders helped inspire participation in other subsequent civil rights campaigns, including voter registration throughout the South, freedom schools, and the black power movement. At the time, most blacks in southern states had been unable to register to vote, due to constitutions, laws and practices that had effectively disfranchised most of them since the turn of the twentieth century.

In celebration of the 50th anniversary of the Freedom Rides, Oprah Winfrey invited all living Freedom Riders to join her TV program to celebrate their legacy.

FREEDOM RIDERS

William E. Harbour, 81, convicted of breaching the peace in Jackson, MS, served at Parchman Farms maximum security prison. Harbour was the first activist to exit the bus as it arrived at the Montgomery Greyhound Bus Station and the first to encounter the waiting mob. After the Freedom Rides, Harbour taught school for several years, and eventually became a Civilian Federal employee specializing in U.S. Army base closings. Today, Harbour acts as the unofficial archivist of the Freedom Rider Movement.

Hank Thomas, 22, convicted of breaching the peace in Jackson, MS, served at Parchman Farms maximum security prison. The great-great-grandson of an ironworker slave, Thomas also played a part in securing minimum wage legislation. Thomas' goal of registering black people to vote in 1964.

Following his Freedom Rides, Thomas served in the Vietnam War, returning home after being wounded in 1968. In recent years, Thomas has opened and operated several local and fast food restaurants franchises in the Atlanta metro region.

Colvin did attend the 37th Annual Southeastern Church of Christ Youth Conference in Fort Valley, Georgia in July. Track and Field were among the events that he participated in, winning 1st place in the 60 yd. dash; 1st place in the 100 yd. dash; and 1st place in the 200 yd. dash.

One of Colvin's sermons this summer was entitled: "The Benefits of Wisdom." He voiced the value of using wisdom instead of letting Satan kill, steal, and destroy you. Prayerfully, God will continue to bless him spiritually, intellectually, and physically as he upholds his faith in God. He aspires to attend Southwestern Christian College, Harvard University, and ultimately become a heart surgeon and track star.

The Cry Of A Troubled Saint, Psalm 77:1-20

Psalm 77 is a wonderful psalm that describes the awesome cry of a troubled saint. The superscription of this psalm of lament reads: "To the chief Musician, to Jeduthun, A Psalm of Asaph." Jeduthun was a choir director during David's day (I Chronicles 16:41). In studying the psalms of Asaph, we are brought to bear that he

had many troubles that were perplexing. With that thought in mind, I was lead to read certain verses in the book of Job that spoke about the troubles of mankind. Every man dwelling upon this earth is faced with trouble, for Job 14:1 says, "Man that is born of a woman is of a few days, and full of trouble." Again, Job affirms the trouble of man, in that, Job 5:7 states, "Yet man is born unto trouble, as the sparks fly upward."

In verses 1-3, Asaph revealed his problem in his prevailing prayer of asking God to hear him. He had agonized in prayer but it was a failure. In verse 3 he says, "I remembered God, and was troubled: I complained, and my spirit was overwhelmed." As he searched for an answer, he thought of his former days when God did deliver. However, he remained confused and he found no reason for praise (vv. 4-6). Continuing to be in distress, Asaph thought that God had abandoned him and the nation (vv. 7-9).

Because he saw no immediate response he was led to question, "Will the Lord cast off for ever? and will He be favourable no more? (v. 7)."

As believers today, when undergoing trouble, let us remember that God is always with us as we struggle with the issues of life (Hebrews 13:5-6). Although this psalmist was in deep trouble, he really received comfort by meditating

on God's awesome deliverance of Israel during the Exodus (vv. 10-20). He resolves in verses 10-11 to remain confident as he states, "And I said, This is my infirmity: but I will remember the years of the right hand of the most High. I will remember the works of the LORD: surely I will remember thy wonders of old."

God's great power revealed in the past should promote meditative praise for God's people who need a way of rescue for their troubles! If God can rescue in the past, He can rescue those who are in trouble, right now! When trouble arises in our lives, let us trust in the Lord for He knows how to minister in a time of crisis!



Cowboys Cornerback Orlando Scandrick

Suspended For Four Games

Dallas Cowboys cornerback Orlando Scandrick is getting a four-game suspension for violating the league's substance abuse policy.

Team owner Jerry Jones told reporters at a media party in Malibu, California, on Monday night that Scandrick tested positive for performance-enhancing drugs and lost an appeal on the ban.

Scandrick will be eligible to return Oct. 5 against Houston. He will miss the opener against San Francisco, and his final game on the sidelines will be against Drew Brees and the New Orleans Saints, who set an NFL record with 40 first downs against Dallas last year.

The Cowboys are practicing with Oakland on Tuesday and Wednesday at training camp in Oxnard. They break camp Friday.

Scandrick, who is going into his seventh season, became a starter last year when former top 10 pick Morris Claiborne struggled. Now Claiborne is battling tendinitis in his right knee and missed the preseason opener for the third time in his three seasons in Dallas.

Brandon Carr, the other starter, missed the first two weeks of camp to be with his mother in the final days of her battle against breast cancer. He might only play one preseason game but is expected to be ready for the regular season.

The Cowboys had to sign two defensive backs just to get through the preseason opener against the Chargers last week. They're likely to keep scouring the waiver wire, perhaps even looking for a veteran to give them depth while Scandrick is out.

B.W. Webb, a fourth-round pick last year, hasn't shown that he's ready to be a starter. Terrance Mitchell, a rookie seventh-round pick out of Oregon, could get a longer look while Scandrick is sidelined.


