### HEART OF A WARRIOR CHARITABLE FOUNDATION GRADUATES 300 STUDENTS FROM SUMMER EDUCATION PROGRAM

On Friday, August 1, Heart of a Warrior Charitable Foundation (HOAW) graduated 300 students from its Young Warrior Summer Learning program (YWSL) at the University of Dallas. The eight-week program provides a STEM-based curriculum and educational opportunities for underserved children in the Dallas area. Former Dallas Cowboy Herschel Walker delivered the keynote speech and helped Gail Warrior, HOAW Founder and Chairwoman, and members of the Board of Directors present diplomas to the students.

After a successful Backpack Drive to benefit HOAW, representatives from Equinox attended the ceremony and gave each student a backpack. Two students' names were drawn to receive free bicycles based on their attendance and behavior. One special family was rewarded for their dedication and service with the first ever Heart of a Warrior Award.

"We host graduations at local universities to provide continued inspiration and motivation for academic success," said Gail Warrior. "Providing educational experiences and opportunities is our primary focus during the summer but the pursuit of continued, higher education is our ultimate goal. Tours of local universities give our students a glimpse of what their futures could hold."

The graduation ceremony follows an escorted University of Dallas campus tour. Last year's graduation was hosted by Paul Quinn College. In 2012, the celebratory event was held at University of North Texas Dallas, and in 2011 the program's first graduation was held at Southern Methodist University.

### Methodist Health System Opens Charles A. Sammons Tower

First Emergency, Trauma, and Critical Care Tower in North Texas



Methodist Dallas Medical Center will unveil the first patient care tower in Dallas devoted to emergency, trauma, and critical care when it officially opens the Charles A. Sammons Tower on Monday, July 28. The six-story, 248,000-square-foot tower includes a new 59-bed emergency department, eight integrated operating suites, 36-bed surgical intensive care unit (SICU), and 34-bed neurocritical care unit (NCCU), which expands the hospital's total number of beds to 558.

Methodist Dallas, a critical safety-net hospital, is one of only three adult trauma centers in Dallas County and the only one in southern Dallas County. The medical center's emergency department treats more than 60,000 patients annually, including 1,600 trauma patients. The tower expansion provides the hospital with increased capacity to treat 90,000 patients annually. Currently designated as a level II trauma center, the hospital completed the survey process in July to receive level I verification and expects formal notification within the next eight to 12 weeks.

"The \$123-million investment by Methodist Health System in southern Dallas County is the first by a corporation in recent years and one of the largest ever. It demonstrates an ongoing commitment to the southern sector," said Stephen L. Mansfield, PhD, FACHE, president and CEO, Methodist Health System. "Methodist Health System has experienced aggressive growth during the past several years, and is proud to be the largest employer in Southern Dallas."

The overall design of the new tower promotes efficiencies and provides a healing atmosphere by incorporating an abundance of natural lighting into patient care and lobby areas. Trauma rooms, operating suites, and patient rooms were constructed with additional space to accommodate advanced critical care medical equipment and enhance patient comfort.

"For more than 85 years, Methodist Dallas has been committed to serving Dallas with innovative medical services," said Laura Irvine, FACHE, president, Methodist Dallas Medical Center. "The new Sammons Tower advances emergency, trauma, and critical care services extending our mission to improve and save lives."

The tower's distinct layout focuses on decentralized nursing by locating nurses closer to patients. The pod design of the new emergency department supports efficiencies that will enhance patient care. Each pod features private patient rooms with dedicated support services to allow staff to spend more time with patients. Pods are arranged so they can be staffed up or down based on patient demand. Natural light plays a critical role throughout the design of the patient floors with glass being used to lessen noise while improving visibility.

## MY DAY: Life & Reality Confused Part 1

August 17, is the birthday of Marcus Garvey, one of the most important anti-imperialist leaders of the last 150 years. No African has been more successful in organizing African people towards the liberation and unification of Africa and Africans, than Marcus Garvey and the Universal Negro Improvement and African Communities League (UNIA/ACL). Garvey was born in Jamaica and immigrated to Harlem in 1916 at the age of 28. In his homeland he had been an admirer of Booker T. Washington's philosophy of self-improvement for people of African descent and had formed the Jamaica Improvement Association. When he arrived in America

his ideas expanded and he became a Black Nationalist. For him, Africa was the ancestral home and spiritual base for all people of African descent. His political goal was to take Africa back from European domination and build a free and United Black Africa. He advocated the Back-to-Africa Movement and organized a shipping company called the Black Star Line which was part of his program to conduct international trade between black Africans and the rest of the world in order to "uplift the race" and eventually return to Africa.

Garvey studied all of the literature he could find on African history and culture and decided to launch the Universal Negro Improvement Association with the goal of unifying "all the Negro peoples of the world into one great body and to establish a country and government absolutely on their own". The motto of the U.N.I.A. was "One God! One Aim! One Destiny." The Negro World was the U.N.I.A. weekly newspaper

founded in 1918. It was published in French and Spanish as well as English. In it African history and heroes were glorified.

The ranks of the U.N.I.A. were comprised of African "nobility" - knights of the Nile, dukes of the Niger and Uganda; knights of Ethiopia, duchesses, etc. Garvey himself was the "Provisional President of Africa" and he and the members of his empire paraded in elaborate military uniforms. Harlem loved parades and street ceremonies, and the U.N.I.A. gave the grandest. During their annual conventions, thousands of delegates from all over the United States, the Caribbean, Central America and Africa marched up and down the streets of Harlem with their banners, uniforms and colorfully decorated cars.

Happy Birthday Marcus Garvey.

Marcus Garvey was born August 17, 1887, and 127 years after his birth, we are still faced with some of the convictions of his day and times.

## Prime Prep Academy appeals charter decision School officials secure deal to repay \$45K in mis-used funds

Wednesday Prime Prep Academy officials said that they were one step closer to keeping their school charter. Critics were counting the days until the charter school cofounded by former professional athlete Deion Sanders. But according to Prime Prep Academy Superintendent Ron Price they have made serious strides to correct the mismanagement by former Executive Director Damien Wallace.

"Our attorneys are finalizing that and they are going to submit it first thing in the morning. We feel comfortable that we have a good case and that we have done everything the state has asked of us."

Two weeks ago via letter TEA Chief Deputy Commissioner of Education Lizzette Gonzales Reynolds informed Prime Prep of her intent to revoke the school's charter. Reynolds cited the school's failure to comply with state education mandates as well as

seriously lacking fiscal management.

"We have to show them that all of our structures, checks and balances have changed so that they know the mistakes that happened in the past will not occur again," said Price.

More specifically the mistakes Price is referring to is the fraudulent claim by previous administrators to the Texas Agriculture Commissioner for more than \$45,000 in 2013.

TDA investigators discovered a number of discrepancies in the amount of monies requested by Prime Prep Academy for their child nutrition program and the amount of meals actually served.

In a April 21, 2014 notice Mueck informed Uplift Fort Worth that its intended to reclaim the \$45,830.92 paid to Prime Prep in recompense for meals the school allegedly served during the months of September, October and November 2013.

As of last Thursday Price has struck a deal to repay the monies misappropriat-

ed by then director level administrators. Over the next 12 months the school would make payments of \$3,820. But the promissory note doesn't make everything all good.

Now their written argument will go before the TEA officials must also submit all the documentation that has been lapsed over the past three years including supporting arguments.

"If, after the informal review is completed. I do not change my decision to seek revocation of the charter, this matter will be docketed with the State Office of Administrative Hearings for a hearing pursuant to TEC (Texas Education Code) 12.116," said Reynolds.

According to that same law the administrative law judge must uphold Reynolds' decision unless there is proof of capricious or malicious intent on behalf of the TEA official or erroneous evidence in the case. From there the judge's ruling is final and may not be appealed.

## FORMER COWBOYS RB NEWHOUSE DIES AT 64

DALLAS (AP) -- Robert Newhouse, who played running back for the Dallas Cowboys for 12 seasons and went to three Super Bowls, has died. He was 64.

Newhouse's son, Rodd Newhouse, says his father died Tuesday at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, after a battle with heart disease.

Newhouse had suffered a stroke in 2010.

The burly running back

was drafted by the Cowboys in 1972 out of the University of Houston, where he ran for 1,757 yards as a senior, a school record that still stands.

Newhouse ran for 4,784 yards in his career with Dallas. He retired in 1983 after playing in three Super Bowls with some of the Cowboys greatest teams, including the 1976 NFL champions.

In the 1977 Super Bowl



victory against Denver, Newhouse threw a 29-yard touchdown pass to Golden Richards on a halfback option to help seal the win.

Newhouse was born in Longview and went to Galilee High School in Hallsville before enrolling at Houston. All three Cougars teams he played on finished the season ranked in The Associated Press Top 20.

He was taken in the sec-

ond round of the draft by Dallas. He led the Cowboys in rushing in 1975 with 930 yards, but became most well known as a fullback leading the way for future Hall of Famer Tony Dorsett, who Dallas drafted in 1977.

Newhouse is survived by his wife, Nancy, daughters, Dawnyel and Shawntel, and sons Rodd and Reggie, who played for the Arizona Cardinals in 2004-05.

Dear Editor,

Warmer temperatures are a welcome change after a long, cold winter—but as the mercury rises, it's crucial to protect our animal companions by never leaving them in parked vehi-

cles. Every year, PETA receives dozens of reports of animals suffering and dying in hot, parked cars. Cruelty-to-animals charges are routinely filed in such cases.

It only takes minutes for a parked car to cook an animal alive: On a warm

day, even with the windows cracked, the temperature inside a parked car can reach more than 160 degrees. Parking in the shade and/or leaving water in the vehicle won't help. Symptoms of heatstroke include restlessness, excessive thirst, heavy panting, lethargy, lack of appetite and coordination, dark tongue, and vomiting. Dogs can succumb to heatstroke in just 15 minutes, resulting in brain damage or death.

Please, when it's even a little warm

outside, never leave any living being in a parked car, even for "just a minute." If you see a dog left in a car, have the owner paged or call 911 immediately—the dog's life depends on it. Visit www.PETA.org to learn more.

America has endured a long and painful history of voter disenfranchisement. There were times when minority citizens were forced to pay poll taxes before they could exercise the right to vote. Many died in the fight against discriminatory laws and practices to secure the right to participate in America's democracy. I have also experienced the unjust practices of voter disenfranchisement during my youth under the Jim Crow laws in Texas.

In June of 2013, a five to four majority ruling by the United States Supreme weakened the Voting Rights Acts of 1965.

The ruling allowed states

like Texas, with a long history of discriminatory voting practices, to reinstate practices, such as stricter voter identification laws that are designed specifically to dilute the number of minority and student voters. During the 2014 Texas State Republican Convention held in North Texas, a platform was released requesting that the Voting Rights Law be repealed in its entirety. The law, against which they have waged a war, is a historic piece of legislation signed into law by a Texan, former President Lyndon Baines Johnson.

The Voting Rights Law is recognized by fair-minded citizens as one of the most important pieces of civil rights legislation in our nation's history, and we must not allow it to be further weakened or discarded.

The Texas Legislature has yet to draw redistricting maps that give minorities a fair chance of electing minority representatives to Congress in areas where minority representation is clearly warranted.

### Fairness in Voting

That is why I am currently participating in litigation demanding that minority voters be treated fairly in Texas.

I am in full support of the proposed legislation written by Democratic Congressman John Conyers and Republican Representative James Sensenbrenner that would require certain states to seek approval from the Justice Department before making changing in its voting practices.

Under the proposed legislation, states that have had at least five irregularities in Voting Rights practices would be subject to federal clearance and oversight. Counties and cities where at least three violations occurred within a 15-year period would also have to seek federal clearance before making changes to their voting laws. This is to insure that those areas of the country with a history of voter disenfranchisement do not revert to discriminatory tactics aimed at marginalizing minority voters. In addition to restricting

existing voters, many states also restrict the voting rights of men and women who were convicted of a felony, but have repaid their debt to society. Eleven states still continue the practice of restricting voting rights of those who have served prison time.

Attorney General Eric Holder said earlier this year that the practice disenfranchises African-American citizens, and other racial minorities.

When the Supreme Court gutted the Voting Rights Act, its majority held that the oversight of voting practices in states was no longer necessary. This is far from the truth.

Perhaps, there will come a day when we no longer need the government to provide protections for racial minorities. That day has not yet come. And until it comes, our government must ensure fairness and equality in voting for all of our citizens, and our citizens must be vigilant to fight to protect this constitutional right.

In 1984, former UN Ambassador Andrew Young described the inner circle of Democratic presidential nominee Walter Mondale as "smart a- White boys" who thought they knew everything. Obviously, they didn't because Mondale lost the general election by a large margin to Ronald Reagan.

Knowing that in a president's second-term, the party in power usually loses 29 House seats, along with the real possibility of Democrats losing control of the Senate this year, some party leaders are trying to give the appearance they are in control and Democrats will buck that historical voting trend.

In an interview with a group of African American reporters last week, for example, Rep. Steve Israel (D-N.Y.), chairman of the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee, described how much better positioned Democrats are this year compared to past off-year elections. He spoke of the DCCC hiring a diversity director for the first time, adding a national voter training director, cre-

ating an Internet platform for vendors of color and allowing resumes to be dropped off in the field.

In other words, he talked about the kind of things smart butt White boys talk about. My fear is that another group of smart butt White boys will lead Democrats down the path of defeat unless the strategists reverse course.

The upcoming mid-term election may be yet another example of Black voters never getting the credit they deserve winning seats for the party but getting an overabundance of blame when Democrats get their heads handed to them.

The Washington Post, carried a story under the headline, "Will black voters be House Democrats' midterm firewall?" In the story, Israel noted that in 15 of the top 25 districts being targeted by the DCCC, Blacks make up at least 10 percent of the voting-age population, enough to provide the margin of victory.

"We have a unique challenge in offsetting drop off with African American voters, with Hispanic voters, and with young female voters," Israel said. "So we're tackling those challenges head on."

In the meeting with reporters, Israel mentioned efforts from getting commercials cut by First Lady Michelle Obama to getting Black voters to sign cards committing them to vote in November. As Election Day nears, those cards will be mailed back to prospective voters, hoping that action will get them to

turn up at the polls.

The most troubling aspect of the exchange with Israel was that he appears to be putting more faith in such long-shot gimmicks as voter commitment cards than reaching the Black community through the Black Press.

In fact, when pressed on the issue of utilizing Black media, Israel said while there may be some Black media buys, "The vast majority of our budget is spent on one thing - that is buying television time. That's it."

That may be "it" for Democrats in November if they think the best way to reach Black voters is to lump them in with everyone else who watches TV. Even if television reaches more Black voters than Black newspapers, radio stations, magazines and Internet sites, it is not as trusted by African Americans as the Black Press.

As a Nielsen study found, "Companies mistakenly believe there are no language barriers, that a general market 'one-size-fits-all' strategy is an effective way to reach African-Americans. Just the opposite is true."

If smart butt White boys are as smart as they think, they would recognize that in the Black community, the messenger is as important as the message. And that is not limited to the Black Press. It also applies to the largely White-controlled 527 organizations established in recent elections that acted as though they knew more about our community than

grass root organizations that are on the ground every day, yet continue to struggle for funding.

Democrats face another hurdle - 67 percent of the Democratic base does not know there is a mid-term election in November, according to polling done for the DCCC by Cornel Belcher, an African American.

In addition, a poll conducted by the Pew Research Center in July found: "Currently, 45% of registered voters who plan to support the Republican in their district say they are more enthusiastic about voting than in prior congressional elections; that compares with 37% of those who plan to vote for the Democratic candidate."

Democrats need to give Blacks something to vote for rather than overly relying Republican calls for impeachment to motivate the Black base.

According to an analysis of the Black vote by the Associated Press, African Americans voted at a higher rate than Whites in 2008 and 2012. Obviously, having Barack Obama's name on the ballot was a key factor.

Blacks can vote at high levels again in 2014 if they understand the success or failure Obama's last two years in office will be determined by who gets elected in November. But if Democrats stubbornly stick to relying on television to reach Black voters, they will lose in 2014 just as smart butt White boys lost 30 years ago.

### "A THANKSGIVING OF PRAISE FOR A VICTORY WROUGHT" PSALM 76:1-12

Assyrian army of Sennacherib in 701 B.C. This psalm teaches that God has complete control, and when the time comes, He will ultimately execute justice. Prophetically, this psalm looks forward to the future when Christ will come in His glory to judge mankind (Revelation 19:11-16).

In verses 1-3, the psalmist announced that God made Himself known by the devastating way He destroyed Israel's enemies as the psalmist states, "In Judah is God known: His name is great in Israel" (v. 1). God's great judgment on the nations of the past served to authenticate that He will destroy those nations who are against Him in the future. When Christ comes back during His Second

Coming to the earth to set up His Millennium Reign, that period will be marked by peace, for Isaiah 2:4 states: "And He shall judge among the nations, and shall rebuke many people: and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks: nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more."

Because of the Lord's victory over Israel's enemies, Asaph praises God transcendent glory (vv. 4-6). In verse 4 he proclaims, "Thou art more glorious and excellent than the mountains of prey." Certainly, the Lord's power to destroy His enemies achieved His purpose; thus, God's wrath displayed against His enemies resulted in believers praising

Him (vv. 7-10). He will be feared as verse 7 acknowledges, "Thou, even thou, art to be feared: and who may stand in thy sight when once thou art angry?" And He will be praised, "Surely the wrath of man shall praise thee: the remainder of wrath shalt thou restrain" (v. 10).

As a result of God's awesome judgment on His enemies that resulted in Israel's deliverance, Asaph instructs leaders in verses 11-12 to pledge their allegiance to God to avert His judgment against them: "Vow, and pay unto the LORD your God: let all that be round about Him bring presents unto Him that ought to be feared" (v. 11).



**Free Back-to-School Immunization Clinic August 16**

Dallas County Health and Human Services (DCHHS) is offering families eligible for the Texas Vaccines for Children (TVFC) program an opportunity to get children immunized for free. DCHHS will open its immunization clinic on Saturday, August 16 from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. The clinic is located on the first floor of the DCHHS building at 2377 N. Stemmons Frwy. in Dallas. Parents must bring their child's vaccination records. Appointments aren't necessary.

"Preparing to go back to school is a great time to catch up on vaccinations," said Dr. Christopher Perkins, DCHHS medical director/health authority. "However, we urge all parents to make sure their children are up to date on vaccinations at all times."

Dallas County residents from birth to age 18 in the following categories are eligible to receive free immunizations on August 16 under the TVFC program:

- Medicaid eligible
- Uninsured: a child who has no health insurance coverage
- American Indian or Alaskan Native
- Enrolled in CHIP
- Underinsured (as defined by the Texas Department of State Health Services): a child who has commercial (private) health insurance, but coverage does not include vaccines; a child whose insurance covers only selected vaccines (TVFC-eligible for non-covered vaccines only); or a child whose insurance caps vaccine coverage at a certain amount. Once that coverage amount is reached, the child is categorized as underinsured).

Insured children with vaccine coverage who have high copays or deductibles are no longer considered underinsured. These children are now considered fully, privately insured and are no longer eligible for TVFC vaccines.

To find out whether a child is eligible for TVFC, check with the insurance provider to determine whether immunizations are covered.

"While this free clinic is a great opportunity for families to bring their children in, we encourage them to take advantage of low cost vaccinations at our clinics in the community," said Zachary Thompson, DCHHS director.

DCHHS has six clinics open Monday-Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Immunization costs for TVFC-eligible children are \$10 for the child's first visit and \$5 for returning patients. Waivers are given to families in need.

Clinic locations are: 2377 N. Stemmons Frwy. Room 159 in Dallas; 8202 Spring Valley Rd. Suite 100 in Dallas; 3312 N. Buckner Blvd. Suite 200 in Dallas; 1113 E. Jefferson Blvd. Suite 200 in Dallas; 440 S. Nursery Rd. in Irving; and 2774 Valwood Pkwy. in Farmers Branch.

### Miami Heat Re-Signs Chris Bosh

The Miami HEAT announced today that they have re-signed forward Chris Bosh. Per club policy, terms of the deal were not disclosed.

"Chris Bosh is a two-time NBA champion and one of the most versatile big men in the league," said HEAT President Pat Riley. "His unique skillset makes him one of the best players in the game today. I've always felt he was committed to this organization, this staff and this city. I think he's going to have the opportunity of a lifetime leading this team next season and having the nine-time NBA All-Star back in the fold was a big key for us. We are very blessed to have him."

Bosh, a two-time NBA champion, has appeared in 796 games (784 starts) during his 11-year NBA career, averaging 19.2 points, 8.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 1.10 blocks and 35.9 minutes, while shooting 49.8 percent from the floor and 80 percent from the foul line. The nine-

time NBA All-Star has appeared in 287 games (all starts) for the HEAT over the last four seasons, averaging 17.3 points, 7.4 rebounds, 1.6 assists and 34.1 minutes while shooting 50.9 percent from the field and 81.3 percent from the foul line. Among the HEAT's all-time leaders, he ranks third in free throw percentage, fourth in field goal percentage, seventh in blocks (273), ninth in free throws made (1,077) and defensive rebounds (1,652), 10th in points (4,976), field goals made (1,894), total rebounds (2,116), and double-figure scoring efforts (260), 11th in double-doubles (60), 12th in starts, 13th in offensive rebounds (464), and minutes (9,787), 16th in games played and 18th in steals (256).

Last season, Bosh started all 79 games in which he appeared and averaged 16.2 points, 6.6 rebounds, 1.1 assists, 1.01 steals and 32.0 minutes while shooting 51.6 percent from the field and 82

percent from the foul line. He totaled a career-high 80 steals and connected on a career-high 74 three-point field goals. He has now totaled 111 treys during his HEAT career, the most by a player 6'11" or taller in franchise history. Bosh scored his 15,000th career point on March 12 vs. Brooklyn, recorded his 1,500th career assist on December 8 at Detroit and went a perfect 9-of-9 from the field on January 4 at Orlando, tying for the most makes without a miss during a single game in HEAT history. He earned Player of the Week honors on December 29 and improved Miami's record to a perfect 12-0 when scoring at least 30 points as a member of the HEAT, including a 37-point effort on December 28 at Portland, a game in which he hit the game-winning three-point attempt with five-thirtieths of a second remaining to give Miami a 108-107, victory.

Bosh has appeared in 78 postseason games (74 starts) with the HEAT and averaged 14.9 points, 7.3 rebounds, 1.14 blocks, 1.1 assists and 34.7 minutes while shooting 48.1 percent from the field, 40.6 percent from three-point range and 79 percent from the foul line. Last postseason, he shot 69.2 percent (9-of-13) from three-point range in Round One against Charlotte, the highest three-point field goal percentage during a four-game series in HEAT postseason history. He has now appeared in the NBA Finals in each of his four seasons in Miami, helping the HEAT become just the third NBA franchise to make four-straight NBA Finals appearances.
