




with the Giants, where he won a World Series in 1954, was a 24-time All-Star, and was a two-time National League MVP. Among many other accomplishments, his 660 home runs and 12 Gold Gloves highlight his legendary status.

Hernandez, who now serves as a color commentator for the Mets, reflected on Mays' remarkable skills. "Willie would play a shallow centerfield, making it all the more amazing how he'd catch fly balls against the wall," added Mets broadcaster Gary Cohen. "He was the greatest ever to play."

Just a day prior, it was announced that Mays would not attend a special game honoring him and the Negro Leagues. Scheduled for Thursday, June 20, at Rickwood Field, the game features the San Francisco Giants and the St. Louis Cardinals. Mays, who began his career with the Birmingham Black Barons of the Negro Leagues, had shared his plans to enjoy the event from home. "I'm not able to get to Birmingham this year but will follow the game back here in the Bay Area," he told the San Francisco Chronicle earlier in the week. "My heart will be with all of you who are honoring the Negro League ballplayers, who should always be remembered, including all my teammates on the Black Barons."

Mays' career spanned from 1951 to 1972

Mays was not only a baseball legend but also a cherished figure in San Francisco. His 9-foot bronze statue stands proudly at Oracle Park's 24 Willie Mays Plaza. He was eager to see MLB's tribute at Rickwood Field, where he began his career.

Known for his exceptional five-tool abilities-hitting, power hitting, fielding, throwing, and baserunning-Mays also possessed an unmatched strategic acumen. In 2015, he received the Presidential Medal of Freedom from President Obama, who acknowledged Mays' impact on sports and society. "It's because of giants like Willie that someone like me could even think about running for president," Obama remarked.

Mays was dedicated to helping others throughout his life, notably through his Say Hey Foundation, which supports underprivileged youth. "I do what I can for people, man," Mays said in a 2021 interview. "When the kids ask me for something, I give it to them. Let them have it because they're going to be here after I'm gone, and I want the kids to enjoy what they can enjoy."

A career batting average of.302, 3,283 hits, and numerous honors define Mays' legacy. He was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1979, cementing his place as one of the sport's alltime greats.

## A Survey of Second Thessalonians

After the church goes to heaven with the bridegroom (The Lord Jesus), then the tribulation period will begin. You see, the Day of the Lord begins the Tribulation Period. Every saint of this church age who has placed their faith in Christ's finished work on Calvary is exempted from the wrath (Tribulation Period) to come (I Thessalonians 1:10, 5:9). The church will be raptured before that awful seven years of tribulation. Certainly, this epistle is an awesome one instructing us that we have been exempted from that awful event - the tribulation period. We may be undergoing troubles now, but our troubles are no comparison to the awful event of the tribulation period. To read about this awful period, the curious mind should read Revelations Chapters 6-18. This grand book can be outlines this way:

I. Paul's Commendation and

Encouragement in View of Their Persecution – II Thessalonians 1:1-12

II. Paul's Explanation Concerning the Day of the Lord – II Thessalonians 2:1-17

III. Paul's Admonition to the Church – II Thessalonians 3:1-10

Lastly, the key verse of this marvelous epistle is found in I Thessalonians 2:2-3, which says – "That ye be not soon shaken in mind, or be troubled, neither by spirit, nor by word, nor by letter as from us, as that the Day of Christ (Day of the Lord) is at hand." "Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition."

The wonderful sequel to I Thessalonians is II Thessalonians which was written by the Apostle Paul from Corinth in A.D. 51. Paul wrote this very informative epistle to comfort and correct a severe problem that had upset the spiritual health of the church. The problem that prompted Paul to write this epistle was the erroneous teaching of the false teachers with their claim that the "Day of the Lord" had already arrived. With such a hideous claim, the false teachers had greatly upset the minds and hearts of the saints, because in the minds and hearts of the saints, they concluded that they had missed the "Day of Christ" (The Rapture) and because of the persecution in which they were experiencing, they were thinking that the "Day of the Lord" had overtaken them.

In a previous article we discussed the "Day of the Lord" this way: "it is a period of time that begins with the tribulation period and goes throughout the Millennium. It is a period that includes both blessings and cursings. Such a claim by these false teachers greatly disturbed the hearts and minds of the Thessalonian saints. While Paul was with this growing church, he taught with diligence the "imminent return of Christ." He taught that the Lord could come and dispatch His church at any moment. The next event on God's eschatological calendar is the "Rapture of the Church." By the term eschatology, we mean the end-time events.

In following God's time table for events correctly, the Rapture will come first, followed by the Day of the Lord. But the false teachers had the saints disturbed in thinking that because of their experience in persecution that they were in the midst of the "Day of the Lord." To combat the false teachers' claim, Paul will comfort and also instruct the saints that certain things must take place before that period – spiritual rebellion or apostasy must take place and the revelation of the man of lawlessness (Antichrist) must make his arrival when the restrainer (The Holy Spirit) is removed (II Thessalonians 2:6-9). Paul's only prescription to the hideous teaching of the false teachers is a high dosage of God's word. Yes, the word of God will soothe any troubled heart.

The abounding theme for this grand book is the coming of the Lord. The Lord's coming back is a most comforting promise to any saint. When the Lord comes the second time, He will pick up His church – a group of called believers since Acts Chapter 2. At the Rapture, only the saints of this church age will meet Him in the mid-air (I Thessalonians 4:13-18, I Corinthians 15:51-58).







Are You Raising One of the Next Generation of Hoodlums?

## Are you ready for summer?

Allow me to take the liberty to remind readers once again as I did nearly a year ago at the beginning of a new school year that we are again at the end of another school year and the start of summer vacation for millions of children throughout the United States. Summer is a critical time for children because many of them are left without adequate supervision. For some unknown reason, many parents truly believe that if their children are thirteen or fourteen years old (and sometimes even younger), they can stay at home with no supervision, and even babysit younger siblings while parents are at work. But this simply is not true!

While the child may appear mature enough to handle this responsibility, it is important that parents understand that a thirteen or fourteen-year- old child is still a child, and as such should not be burdened with the responsibility that many mature adults have trouble handling satisfactorily.

I appeal to parents once again. If you have not already done so, begin now investigating summer programs and activities that will engage your children in programs that will occupy them in positive ways while at the same time assuring that they are not idle and looking to easily get into mischief, some of which may be criminal.

Not one week passes (and sometimes not one day) when we don't hear about one or more of our children being involved in negative activities which involve them early in their lives in the juvenile justice system, a system that is not kind to our children. But I assert that the children whose parents keep them involved in wholesome, age-appropriate activities that are of interest to the children have a lot fewer problems of this nature.

A big part of positive parenting is helping your child to feel good about himself or herself by nurturing self-esteem without going overboard. It is important to realize that this does not come from catering to his or her every whim or showering him or her with insincere flattery, but by praising your child's legitimate accomplishments. When you engage your child in healthy pursuits that assist to keep him/her focused in a positive direction, you and your child both will feel good about his/her accomplishments.

Are you raising one of the next generation of hoodlums? A truthful negative response to this query is primarily in your hands. You can be in the process of raising a wonderful boy (or girl) who will be proud of him or herself and who will make you a proud parent. But the operative word is YOU. You must take the time to find out about age-appropriate summer programs available in your area. You must be willing to make the sacrifices necessary to pay the fee, if one is required. You must be willing to assume the responsibility to transport your child to and from the activity (or make safe arrangements). Be aware that you can raise your child in such a way that he or she will be a joy to you. You will be able to enjoy your child's company, and so will the other adults with whom he or she has contact. And I repeat, the operative word is YOU. Children are going to be children. They are going to be immature and occasionally mischievous. It's the nature of children. But they respond to being loved and nurtured. AND **DISCIPLINED!** 

Look out for your child. Head off trouble by keeping your child positively engaged. Yes, to do so requires sacrifice, but today's sacrifice can mean tomorrow's peace of mind. And when you love your child, you have peace of mind only when he or she is doing well!



Griffin, who resigned days before the January 6, 2021, Capitol riot and later demanded Trump's resignation, also noted that Trump made such statements in front of "a dozen other" people. While not explicitly confirming the specific incident, Barr did not dispute the possibility, telling Collins in April, "I remember him being very mad. ... I actually don't remember him saying 'executing,' but I wouldn't dispute it."

The accounts contribute to a disturbing pattern of behavior by Trump, who has a history of using violent rhetoric and expressing admiration for violent acts. He has praised the rioters

on January 6 as "warriors' and "hostages" and warned of a "bloodbath" if he loses the 2024 election.

Trump has suggested the execution of Joint Chiefs Chairman General Mark Milley. During his 2016 campaign, he encouraged supporters to "knock the crap out" of protestors, promising to pay their legal bills. He also infamously commented that there was "blame on both sides" after violent clashes in Charlottesville involving white nationalists and neo-Nazis and praised a Republican who attacked a reporter, saying, "Any guy that can do a body slam, he is my type!"

At a debate, Trump refused to condemn white

telling the Proud Boys to "stand back and stand by." Before the Capitol riot on January 6, he told his supporters, "You'll never take back our country with weakness ... If you don't fight like hell, you're not going to have a country anymore."

He has also suggested violence could erupt if court cases against him do not go his way, repeatedly expressed a desire to be a dictator, and dehumanized political opponents and migrants.

**Biden-Harris** 2024 spokesperson James Singer released a statement condemning Trump's rhetoric and behavior in response to these revelations. "Donald Trump has been convicted
