Dallas 2024 Bond **Propositions** Approved by **Voters**

All ten of the propositions making up the City of Dallas' proposed \$1.25 billion bond were approved by voters in the May 4, 2024 election. The election results will be certified by the City Council at their May 15, 2024 meeting.

The approved propositions include Proposition A, which provides \$521,200,000 for streets and transportation; Proposition B which provides \$345,270,000 for parks and recreational facilities; Proposition C, which provides \$52,100,000 for flood control and storm drainage; Proposition D, which provides \$43,530,000 for libraries; Proposition E, which provides \$75,200,000 for cultural and performing arts facilities; Proposition F, which provides \$90 million for public

VP Harris Announces \$5.5 Billion Funding for Affordable Housing and **Homelessness Solutions**

The staggering increase has left many families struggling to afford rent or homeownership, and, according to recent data, around a quarter of renters, equivalent to roughly 12 million households, are spending more than half of their income on housing costs, far exceeding the recommended one-third threshold for financial health.

A housing crisis is gripping tens of millions of families nationwide, cutting across

political lines and sparking bipartisan action in state legislatures.

The root cause of the crisis is a chronic housing shortage, which has driven home prices up by approximately 60 percent after adjusting for inflation over the past decade. Paul's Vital Instructions for Believers

I Thessalonians 4:1-12

Part I



Having discussed with this church their exemplary reception of the gospel, which resulted in their manifesting the fruit of the gospel, and his (Paul's) motive for ministering to them (Chapters 1-3), Paul exhorted Thessalonians believers that God's will is for them to be separated to holiness and moral purity. Also, exhorted these believers to be committed in demonstrating love. Our text, I Thessalonians 4:1-12, may be outlined as follows: I. An Exhortation to Walk in Holiness Thessalonians 4:1-8; II. Exhortation Demonstrate Brotherly Love – I Thessalonians

I. An Exhortation to Walk in Holiness – I Thessalonians 4:1-8

In verse 1, Paul exhorted these believers to walk even more to please the Lord (Chapter 4:1). They (Paul and his associates) conveyed the word to them by the authority of the Lord Jesus (v.2). The very teaching of Paul to these believers, if practiced, would continue to result in exemplary Christian living. In verse 3, Paul moved on to an even more particular exhortation for these believers. He will state to them that God's will is for believers to be holy. Paul calls upon these believers to manifest chaste behaviour by avoiding any form of sexual impropriety.

As Christians, we are called to a life of complete God dedication to (Romans 12:1-2), and "living loose" in an ungodly world doesn't serve to glorify God. God is definitely pleased with us when our behaviour is in alignment with our belief. And by the way, what does it mean to be holy? To be holy means to be set apart from sin, for God's intended use. God wants us to be holy (Lev.11:44; I Peter 1:15-16) because holiness is one of God's moral attributes; thus, if we want to be like Him, we are called to a life of holiness.

Continuing in his exhortation to the believers, Paul related in verse 4 that they (the believers) can exercise self-control in this area by subduing their fleshly passions.

In verse 5, the word "lust" refers to depraved and vile passions. Moreover, the word "concupiscence" carries the idea of a strong desire that is sometimes overpowering (Romans 7:7-8; Colossians 3:5).

Only by the enabling power of God can these believers have victory in this area. Temptations are a part of life, and as Christians, we must follow the example of Christ - He used the "word" as His means of victory over temptations (Matthew 4:1-

Furthermore, in verse 6,

Paul stated that these believers were not to emulate the example of the heathen (unbelievers), for they (the unbelievers) were passionately engrossed in their lustful desires. Unbelievers really have a depraved view of morality because they have not submitted themselves to God's revelation (Romans 1:18-24, 28, 32). The word "Gentiles" is a word for heathens, and the term means an unbeliever. As believers in this age, we know God, and we know the type of behavior that God exacts on us. He has called us to a complete life of holiness, and many practices of the world are inconsistent with our calling. In verses 6 and 7, Paul will detail two rea-

sons why sexual wickedness is to be averted: (a) it is a sin, and thus it will be avenged by God (I John 5:17); (b) it goes contrary to God's intended design or purpose for the believ-

In verse 7, believers are called to a life of moral holiness. We are not to "despise" or reject God's instructions to live a life of holiness, for we would be opposing God (v. 8). Certainly, one who disregards God's instructions for holy living will be judged. God has bestowed the power to live a pure life through the Holy Spirit, which indwells every child of God (I Corinthians 6:19).

crucial step in Harris and opportunities accessible to President Joe Biden's efforts to tackle the housing crisis inherited from previous administrations. Harris announced that \$5.5 billion in grants would be distributed to 1,200 communities through more than 2,400 grants to states, cities, Washington, D.C., Puerto Rico, and local organizations nationwide.

"Homeownership is an essential part of the American Dream that represents so much more than a roof over our heads," Harris stated. "That is why President Biden and I are expanding on our historic investments in housing by announcing \$5.5 billion that will increase access to affordable housing, invest in economic growth, and address homelessness in communities throughout America."

The funding, part of the White House Housing Supply Action Plan and the Blueprint for a Renter's Bill of Rights, aims to boost the housing supply, housing costs, lower expand rental assistance, enhance renter protections, and invest in more robust, more resilient communities.

"A coordinated whole-ofcommunity approach is crucial to build strong and resilient communities, invest in decent housing, create healthy environments, expand economic

low-income households, and support aspiring homebuyers and those experiencing homelessness," Acting HUD Secretary Adrianne Todman emphasized in a statement.

The White House said the allocation of the \$5.5 billion in grants would go through various HUD programs, including:

- \$1.3 billion to 668 grantees to build affordable housing through the HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME).
- \$214 million to every state to increase affordable housing supply via the Housing Trust Fund (HTF).
- \$3.3 billion to 1,254 build grantees to stronger communities through the Community Development Block Grants (CDBG).
- \$455 million to 130 grantees to connect people with HIV/AIDS to housing and support through the Housing Opportunities for Persons With HIV/AIDS (HOPWA) program.
- \$290 million to 357 grantees to address homelessness through Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG).
- \$30 million to 23 States

and the District of Columbia to support recovery from substance use disorder via the Recovery Housing Program (RHP).

The announcement follows Harris's recent stops on her nationwide **Economic** Opportunity Tour, where she has been highlighting Biden-Harris the Administration's efforts to support communities and improve access to housing while making it more affordable.


Administration officials pointed out that Harris has been a vocal advocate for homeownership and housaffordability. Attorney General California, she helped pass the California Homeowner Bill of Rights, and as a U.S. Senator, she introduced several bills aimed at increasing the supply of affordable housing and

lowering renters' costs. The White House said the latest funding underscores the administration's commitment to addressing the housing crisis and creating opportunities for Americans to access safe and affordable housing.

"The funding made available today serves as building blocks to empower communities to take ownership of community development investments and put the needs of residents first," Todman asserted.

At this time of year, many preschool parents are worrying about whether their child will be ready for kindergarten. What are the things their child should learn? Do they need to make alphabet flash cards? Invest in worksheets so kids can practice math. I talked with kindergarten teachers to find out what they think kids need to know to be kindergartenready. You may be surprised: Readiness school, teachers say, does not mean that your child will have mastered all the kindergarten skills on Day One. Instead, it means that your child will take pleas-

ure in learning how to do their own.

things on their own. One kindergarten teacher said to me, "I can teach kids their ABCs. I can't teach them —at least not very efficiently-to help them get along with others and to understand that they aren't going to get their own way all the time in school." If you always do things for your child, and always tell them what to do, they will not be able to make their own decisions and learn how to be independent. One good rule of thumb for parents of toddlers: whenever possible, avoid doing things for your child that they can do on

Kindergarteners expected to take responsibility for their belongings. They put their lunch box in the right place. They hang up their coat. During the day, they use the restroom and wash their hands by themselves. In the cafeteria, children must put the straw in their juice box or open the milk carton. They must get the foil on top of the applesauce. "The whole first month in the cafeteria, we're helping children learn to open things," one teacher said. "They're always surprised that

Dallas Approves Deal for a New Women's Professional Soccer Team

DALLAS - On Wednesday, May 8, the Dallas City Council approved a plan for a new women's professional soccer to call the Cotton Bowl Stadium in Fair Park its home for the next two years.

The plan authorized a \$592,000 subsidy for the next two years with the operators of Fair Park to secure a contract with the unnamed USL Super League team to play home games at the stadium in South Dallas. It includes the option to continue for a third year.

On Thursday morning, the team will announce the club's name, logo and other branding during an event at Klyde Warren Park.

"I am excited that Dallas is going to have its firstever women's soccer team,"

said Dallas Mayor Eric L. Johnson. "This city is at the forefront of professional sports, and women's sports in particular. Bringing more professional teams to Dallas diversifies and strengthens our economic portfolio and spurs further economic development. As a lifelong sports fan myself, I am delighted that another professional sports team will soon call Dallas home." Mayor Johnson facilitated the USL Super League launch in Dallas by creating the Ad Hoc Committee on Professional Sports Recruitment and Retention in 2022.

"As the chair of the Ad Hoc Committee on Professional Sports Recruitment, I want to say that I am super excited that in the course of just about three weeks, we have taken

huge leaps in making Dallas the number one sports destination in the country" said Council Member Zarin Gracey. "First, the Dallas Wings, now a newly formed league is recommended for Fair Park. I could not be prouder of this City and the City's leadership and staff for all the work put forth to get this done. Go Dallas!"

"It's an incredible honor for our City to play a part in supporting women's professional sports," said Council Member Adam Bazaldua. "This is a wonderful moment to highlight the importance of continuing to bring opportunities and invest in South Dallas, who has been neglected from so much of the growth in our city for so long. It's imperative we continue to work to bring professional sports teams to our city, as they

play such a crucial role in the economic vitality of Dallas. The possibilities that this partnership will open for South Dallas, Fair Park, and access to women's professional sports in our city is more exciting than I think many can understand."

Biden says he will stop sending bombs and artillery shells to Israel if they launch major invasion of Rafah

President Joe Biden said for the first time Wednesday he would halt some shipments of American weapons to Israel — which he acknowledged have been used to kill civilians in Gaza — if Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu orders a major invasion of the city of Rafah.

"Civilians have been killed in Gaza as a consequence of those bombs and other ways in which they go after population centers," Biden told CNN's Erin Burnett in an exclusive interview on "Erin Burnett OutFront," referring to 2,000-pound bombs that Biden paused

shipments of last week.

"I made it clear that if they go into Rafah – they haven't gone in Rafah yet – if they go into Rafah, I'm not supplying the weapons that have been used historically to deal with Rafah, to deal with the cities – that deal with that problem," Biden said.

The president's announcement that he was prepared to condition American weaponry on Israel's actions amounts to a turning point in the seven-month conflict between Israel Hamas. And his acknowledgment that American bombs had been used to kill civilians in Gaza was a stark recognition of the United States' role in the
