Democrats win control of Virginia statehouse



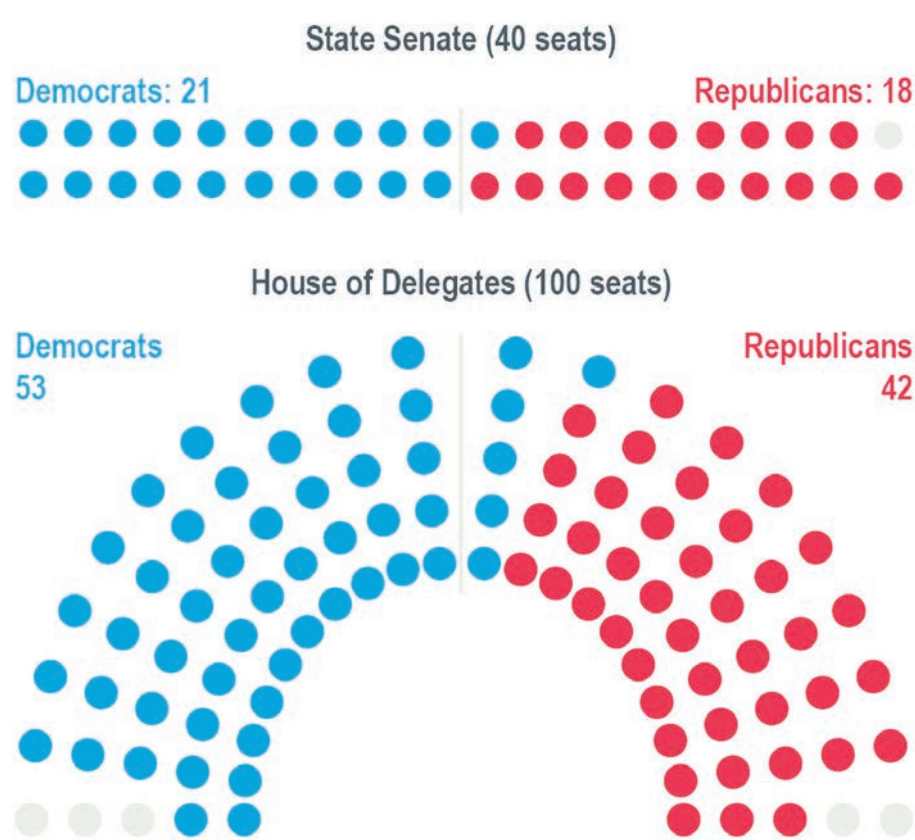
RICHMOND, Va. (AP) — Virginia Democrats are taking full control of the statehouse for the first time in more than two decades.

Democrats won majorities in both the state House and Senate in Tuesday's legislative election. This is the third election in a row that Virginia Democrats have made significant gains since President Donald Trump was elected.

The win will give Democrats control of the legislature and governorship for the first time in 26 years. Democrats have pledged to pass new gun restrictions and raise the minimum wage once in power.

Lacking magic of Senate run, O'Rourke drops presidential bid

WASHINGTON (AP) — Beto O'Rourke, the former Texas congressman, announced Friday that he was ending his Democratic presidential campaign, which failed to recapture the enthusiasm, interest and fundraising prowess of his 2018 Senate bid.

Addressing supporters in Iowa, O'Rourke said he made the decision "reluctantly" and vowed to stay active in the fight to defeat President Donald Trump. "I will be part of this and so will you," he said.

O'Rourke was urged to run for president by many Democrats, including supporters of former President Barack Obama, who were energized by his narrow Senate loss last year in Texas, a reliably Republican state. He raised a record \$80 million from donors across the country, visited every county in Texas and used social media and livestreaming video to engage directly with voters. He to incumbent Republican Sen. Ted Cruz by 3 percentage points.

But O'Rourke, 47, struggled to replicate that model in the presidential primary, and both his polling and his fundraising dwindled significantly in recent months.

O'Rourke's decision comes as the Democratic primary enters a critical stretch. With three months until the kickoff Iowa caucuses, polls consistently show a trio of candidates leading the way: former Vice President Joe Biden, Massachusetts Sen. Elizabeth Warren and Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders, with Pete Buttigieg, the mayor of South Bend, Indiana, showing strength in Iowa, as well. Lower polling candidates face difficult questions about whether they have the money to sustain a campaign through the first primary contests.

“Mr. Reed’s execution is less than one month away, meaning Texas is frighteningly close to executing an innocent man. Between the medical and scientific evidence, and multiple new, credible witnesses, the original case trial has been completely deconstructed and disproven,” said Bryce Benjet, a senior staff attorney at the Innocence Project and Reed’s lead counsel. “It should be clear to anyone who looks at the evidence in this case that Mr. Reed did not commit the sexual assault or murder of Stacey Stites. To execute Mr. Reed would be a grave miscarriage of justice that will create irreparable damage to public confidence in the accuracy and fairness of the Texas criminal justice system.”

Reed, now 51, was arrested nearly a year after Stites’ April 1996 slaying when his DNA surfaced in an unrelated sexual assault. He long has insisted he and Stites had a secret and relationship, accounting for his DNA on her body, and that her police officer fiancé more likely was her killer.

Reed’s lawyers previously have referred to what they describe as the case’s racial aspects. Reed is black and Stites was white.

Reed is scheduled for execution on November 20, 2019. Now after 21 years of confinement, there is a substantial evidence that exonerates Reed and implicates Stites’ fiancé Jimmy Fennell, a local police officer.

In addition to this witness, an amicus brief was

filed this past Monday in the United States Supreme Court by a group of Texas law enforcement officers in support of Reed’s innocence. In the past few weeks, a substantial amount of new information demonstrating Reed’s innocence has come to light. Three new witnesses, who knew Fennell at the time of Stites’ murder, have come forward with information corroborating the of Reed’s innocence and establishing a violation of due process. In order to further investigate this newly discovered evidence, the withdrawal of the impending execution date is required under the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure.

Forensic experts who implicated Reed at trial have recanted their opinions, and leading forensic pathologists have since

concluded that the state’s theory of Reed’s guilt is medically and scientifically impossible. Despite overwhelming evidence of Reed’s innocence, Texas courts have consistently refused to consider the forensic evidence proving Reed did not commit the crime and denied access to DNA testing that can confirm Fennell’s guilt.

Reed’s call for justice, commutation and exoneration have recently been taken up by high-profile individuals, including Dr. Phil McGraw, and . This month, Dr. Phil on his television show. Dr. Cyril Wecht, a forensic pathologist who has examined Stites’ autopsy report, insisted, “without hesitation, that this is one of the clearest, unequivocal cases of gross misjudgment – of a travesty of justice – that I’ve ever seen.”

He was Regal and Resolute!!

When the final history of the United States Congress is written, the name John Conyers, Jr will stand regal and resolute, and the ‘Dean of the House of Representatives’ will be recognized as an influential giant of the American Democracy.

Only five members of Congress served longer tenures in the House than the recently departed member from Detroit, Michigan who served as chairman of the powerful House Judiciary Committee

and the instrumental Committee on Oversight and Reform during his more than fifty-two years in the House of Representatives.

As one of the founding members of the Congressional Black Caucus, Chairman Conyers helped to birth an exemplary organization that became the “Conscience of the Congress,” one with a highly-respected national and global voice and vision.

Many do not know it, but Mrs. Rosa Parks, the civil rights icon struggled to find suitable employment after her refusal to surrender her seat on a Montgomery, Alabama bus during a city-wide boycott. . It was Chairman Conyers who offered her a job in his Detroit congressional office in 1965. Mrs. Parks was a trusted aide to

Congressman Conyers until her retirement in 1988.

It was indeed a delightful and educational experience working with Congressman Conyers in the House of Representatives. He was a sincere and disciplined gentleman whose compassion was extended far beyond those he knew, and those he represented.

Everyone was aware that when Congressman Conyers entered a room, his very presence was regal and resolute. His matchless brilliance and his lawyerly manner preceded him as legions will rightfully testify, and as our nation’s history shall rightly record.

"A JOURNEY THROUGH THE GOSPEL OF JOHN"
St. John 1:14-18

In the previous verses, St. John 1:1-13, we discussed the fact that our Lord had a preexistence before time began; thus, we forth rightly stated that the "Word" is God, for He was and is the creator of this vast universe (St. John 1:1-3). But the infinite One in St. John 1:1-3, became finite. In verse 14, the "infinite One" became manifest and "became flesh." What a marvelous expression as found in verse 14, "And the Word was made (became) flesh." Christ became what He was not previously. He took upon Himself human flesh. Our Lord did not cease to be God, but He became man. God, who is Spirit (St. John 4:24), and in His essence, no man has seen, was clearly manifested in His Son. God's "grace and truth" was fully manifested in Christ (St. John 1:17). Yes, when men saw Jesus, they saw "Deity manifested in human flesh. In conclusion, Our blessed Lord testified to that fact when He replied to Phillip in St. John 14:9, for He said: "he that hath seen me hath seen the Father; and how sayest thou then, Shew us the Father". In Christ's condescension, we have an exhibition of God's love to mankind, a love that was expressed supremely on a cross of shame as Christ gave Himself a ransom for all mankind. And if mankind is willing to be saved, he or she only needs to look in faith to Jesus Christ - in that Christ said in St. John 14:6 - "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by Me."

This is my third article on Dr. Prince, two community affairs networks (CAN) programs and lots of interaction after he left his medical practice.

It is so rewarding to remember that for 35 years Dr. Prince, Dr. Powell and Dr. Watkins maintained a successfully renown medical practice in a stand alone building on Peabody Street, where the waiting room was always full. The building still stands.

"Thank you Dr. Prince", was an article I wrote in 2003 as a UPI Contributor. I was thanking the good doctor for saving my life. His groundbreaking information about the birth control pills, sharing it and positioning it in his practice was the audacity of brilliance. Normally, when I ran into Dr. Prince, we reminisced about my past visits to his office which always culminated into a big laugh about who was most stubborn. In conclusion, I followed his instructions and so did many other women.

AT&T fined \$60M for misleading with 'unlimited' plans

AT&T will pay \$60 million to

settle the government's allegation that it misled customers of unlimited-data plans by slowing down service for heavy users.

The Federal Trade Commission said Tuesday that

AT&T will automatically to customers who signed up for unlimited wireless plans before 2011.

The FTC for not clearly letting customers know that if they used up a certain amount

of data, AT&T would slow their speeds so much that web browsing was almost impossible. It said then that AT&T had throttled at least 3.5 million customers.

The agency says AT&T is

required to say prominently if data speeds or amounts are restricted.

Today, AT&T's website says it may slow speeds of unlimited plans after a certain amount of data is used.

Black cat scampers on field at Cowboys-Giants game

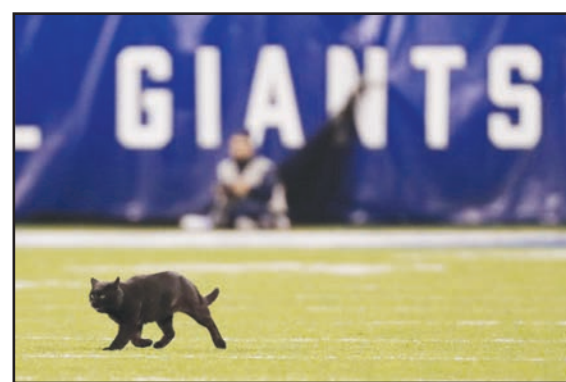
EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. (AP) — A black cat got the best of the Dallas Cowboys and New York Giants for a few minutes Monday night.
