50th Anniversary of President Lyndon B. Johnson Signing Civil Rights Act of 1964



President Lyndon B. Johnson signing Civil Rights Act On July 2, 1964

On July 2, 1964, President Lyndon B. Johnson signed the Civil Rights Act of 1964 into law in the presence of several civil rights leaders, including Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The Civil Rights Act is a landmark piece of legislation in the United States that outlawed discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.

This year marks the 50th Anniversary of President Johnson signing this act into law. On September 25, 2014, Dr. Jerry Chambers of the MLK Community Center Board will take 10 students from Dallas to Washington, D.C. on a historical tour to visit the White House. The tour will also include attending the STEM Conference, as well as visiting the Senate, Congress, Lincoln Mall, and the offices of Congresswoman Eddie Bernice Johnson and Congressman John Lewis.

These students are part of the 2014 MLK Freedom Ride Tour, which was created to provide life-changing opportunities by allowing them to travel and experience real people, places, and events that are important in American History.

Texas Gubernatorial Candidate Wendy Davis Makes Campaign Stop in DeSoto

Approximately 30 DeSoto High School students in government classes had a hands-on experience about elections, government, media, technology, and much more during a live press conference at the school last week.

Texas gubernatorial candidate Wendy Davis used the campus courtroom as a backdrop for a live press conference to address Travis County District Judge Dietz's recent ruling in the public school funding trial.

Dietz ruled the school finance system is inequitable, unsuitable and inadequate in violation of Article VII of the Texas Constitution. In addition, districts do not have meaningful discretion to adopt property tax rates below the statutory maximum, creating, in effect, an unconstitutional state ad valorem tax, also in violation of the state constitution.

Davis was joined by State Representative Helen Giddings and Dallas ISD Board President Miguel Solis.

MVC Community Garden to serve as Healthy Food Oasis



DALLAS-On Thursday Mountain View College hosted a ribbon cutting ceremony in honor of its new Slow Food Community Garden. The 40-bed organic garden will serve not only as a place for area residents and the college's students and employees to plant and cultivate their own foods, but also as a resource to cultivate their learning as well.

The Slow Food Community Garden is the first component of the Living Labs at Mountain View College and will serve as "an outdoor learning space, a neighborhood teaching opportunity and a place for students to gain hands-on experience in multiple disciplines," says Lori De La Cruz, Mountain View College's sustainability coordinator.

The Slow Food Community Garden is the first garden in the Dallas County Community College District that will offer garden beds for annual lease to the public. The garden will offer a much-needed opportunity for residents who lack access to fresh, affordable foods for miles around. Twenty-four of the garden's beds will be available to the community, while the remaining ones will be used for student learning and by faculty and staff. The community garden is located on the west side of the college, northwest of the S Building, and is most easily accessible via Duncanville Road.

The Mountain View College Slow Food Community Garden was funded in part by the Wells Fargo Environmental Solutions for Communities grant program. The college was one of two Dallas-Fort Worth environmental nonprofits that received funds totaling \$78,824 from the grant program, which supports projects focused on land and water conservation, energy efficiency infrastructure and educational outreach in communities across America.

Dear Editor,

Warmer temperatures are a welcome change after a long, cold winter—but as the mercury rises, it's crucial to protect our animal companions by never leaving them in parked vehicles. Every year, PETA receives dozens of reports of ani-

mals suffering and dying in hot, parked cars. Cruelty-to-animals charges are routinely filed in such cases.

It only takes minutes for a parked car to cook an animal alive: On a warm day, even with the windows cracked, the temperature inside a parked car can reach more

than 160 degrees. Parking in the shade and/or leaving water in the vehicle won't help. Symptoms of heatstroke include restlessness, excessive thirst, heavy panting, lethargy, lack of appetite and coordination, dark tongue, and vomiting. Dogs can succumb to heatstroke in just 15 minutes, resulting in brain damage or death.

Please, when it's even a little warm outside, never leave any living being in a parked car, even for "just a minute." If you see a dog

left in a car, have the owner paged or call 911 immediately—the dog's life depends on it. Visit www.PETA.org to learn more.

The number of senior citizens in our country is growing faster than at any other time in our history. They are living longer lives, and many are in need of physical and mental healthcare that will be provided, in many instances, by members of their families.

Data from the 2010 U.S. Census stated that the growth of older persons outpaced that of young people. According to the Census, one of every five persons in our society today is beyond 50 years of age.

It is predicated that in 16 years, one of every five people in our country will be 65 years or older. With longevity comes health issues, and often younger

people are finding themselves having to care for aging parents or grandparents, while holding down full-time jobs, and raising their own families.

There are a number government programs and agencies that can be very helpful to the aged, and to those who are caring for them. The United States Administration on Aging, for instance, provides information on resources for elderly persons that include at home services, legal issues regarding the elderly and care-giving options.

A web site, NIHSeniorHealth.gov, contains information on various diseases, and disorders that can affect elderly persons. Available in written and audio forms, the information is compiled by the National Institutes of Health and the National Library of Medicine.

The site Medicare.gov lists nursing centers as well as long-term care payment options and information on various drug usage plans. The Medicare site is interactive, and easy to navigate.

The National Center for Assisted Living is a perfect tool for those who are faced with having to place a loved one in an institutional facility. It outlines costs, dietary provisions, payment methods and social activities offered by various residential facilities.

As a part of the historic "great society" mandate, former President Lyndon Baines Johnson signed the Older Americans Act of 1965. The administration recognized that the population was aging, and needed assistance.

In 2000, the federal government established The National Family Caregiver Support Program. The program provided grant funding to state governments, allowing them to assist caregivers who were caring for aging family members that lived with them.

The emotional and physical toll on caregivers can be tremendous. The more knowledge a caregiver has about government programs, and other services that are available to assist in the

care of a loved one, the fewer mental and financial pressures they will endure.

For instance, if an elderly parent's social security benefits are extremely low, the caregiver might be able to access additional funding through the Social Security Department's Supplemental Income Program, known as SSI.

Also, since many elderly patients are taking numerous prescription drugs, caregivers should become familiar with the Food and Drug Administration's web site which contains information on drug ingredients, drug interactions, and recommended dosages for prescription medications.

Seniors have worked very hard to create a society in which we are able to live and prosper. In their golden years we must be there for them, just as they were there while they were actively working and laying the foundation for today's society, and its quality standard of living.

instruction. In her activity, she goes to various strategic places seeking to be heard. In other words, wherever there are people, wisdom is there making her appeal. In an effort to be heard, she goes to great length to reach people to listen to her candid advice. She is there for everyone, but she is especially there for the "simple" and "fools" (v.4.). Wisdom is really of no avail until she is listened to and her advice heeded. She is especially trying to draw the naive (simple) and the foolish to listen to her wise advice because they are in need of it, and they will most likely be the ones who will spurn her advice.

In verses 1 - 5, we see wisdom as wise instruction - "O ye simple, understand wisdom: and, ye fools, be ye of an understanding heart" (v. 5). However, in verses 6-9, we will see wisdom's excellent qualities. Wisdom can be

counted on because she speaks that which is right (v.6). In contrast to the unchaste woman of chapter 7, wisdom, if heeded, will steer one in the right direction. She can also be counted upon because she will speak the truth and nothing corrupt will issue from her mouth (v.7.) Man today should want to listen to someone possessed with honesty and uprightness of character; in addition, if he does so, he will be directed in the right path of life. Moreover, wisdom in her exhortation wants people to heed her instructions because they are worth more than silver and gold (v.10, 11).

In verses 12-21, wisdom will be embraced only by those who love and seek her - "I love them that love me; and those that seek me early shall find me" (v.17). She will not force herself upon anyone, but if her advice is heeded, it will result in one

Cops Lied about 'Suicides' of 2 Handcuffed Black Men

report of a fight in the 300 block of Lewis Street. Upon responding to the area, deputies located [Victor] White and discovered he was in possession of illegal narcotics. White was taken into custody, handcuffed behind his back, and transported to the Iberia Parish Sheriff's Office for processing. Once at the Sheriff's Office, White became uncooperative and refused to exit the deputy's patrol vehicle. As the deputy requested assistance from other deputies, White produced a handgun and fired one round striking himself in the back. White was transported to a local hospital by ambulance where he was pronounced dead from an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound."

According to the coroner's report on White, "A small caliber pistol was found and a projectile was found within his shirt." However, two separate police searches of White prior to his being placed in a patrol car produced no weapon.

An investigation by NBC News revealed that the Iberia Parish coroner's report found that White was shot in the front, not the back as police had contended. The bullet entered White's right chest and exited his left armpit. That White could have shot himself in the back while handcuffed behind the back is difficult to fathom. White was left-handed, making it even more

implausible that he could have shot himself in the right chest while in police handcuffs.

NBC said the forensic pathologist found gunshot residue in the wound, but not the kind normally associated with a close-range shooting. White's hands were never tested for gunpowder residue. Two lacerations were found on the left side of White's face. Still, Dr. Carl Ditch, the Iberia Parish coroner, declared White's death a suicide.

The Louisiana case is strikingly similar to that of Chavis Carter in Arkansas. Carter also supposedly committed suicide July 28 while in the backseat of a Jonesboro patrol car.

A crime lab report obtained by the Associated Press under a Freedom of Information Act request said, "In consideration of the circumstances of death and after autopsy of the body, it is our opinion that Chavis Carter, a 21-year-old black male, died of a gunshot wound of the head. The agencies responsible for the investigation of his death were the Jonesboro Police Department and the Craighead County Coroner's Office. They reported that he was detained during a traffic stop.

"He was cuffed and placed into a police car, where apparently he produced a weapon, and despite being handcuffed, shot himself in the head."

Like Victor White, III, Carter was Black and left handed. Also

like the Carter debacle, authorities want us to believe that he managed to conceal a pistol - in Carter's case, a 380-caliber semi-automatic - during two police pat downs. Despite being left handed, police would have us believe he used his right hand to shoot himself in the right temple.

The Associated Press reported, "Carter's death came after police stopped a truck in which he was riding. The driver and another passenger eventually were allowed to go, but police said Carter had an outstanding arrest warrant. Court records show it had to do with a drug charge."

"Carter was searched twice and police said they found a small amount of marijuana, but no gun."

After the first search, an officer put Carter into a patrol car without handcuffing him. He was later searched again, handcuffed and returned to the same car.

"Officers a short time later saw Carter slumped over in the backseat and covered in blood, according to the report, which concluded he had managed to conceal a handgun with which he shot himself. He later died at a hospital, and the report listed his death as a suicide."

Back to School, Back to Basics

Between early August and late September, students are going back to school. Before they go to school, though, they and their parents will hit the malls and stationary stores to prepare for their return. Retailers say that students and their parents will spend \$75 billion on back to school items, and clothing represents about a third of this spending.

Cash registers are also busy collecting money for school supplies, electronic goods and for college students, accessories for their dorm rooms. While many students feel it is important to make the first day of school a fashion show, others can't afford new clothes and are often stigmatized at school.

What if K-12 students wore uniforms? Parents might have to buy two or three uniforms, and costs would be cut. Of course you can "jack" your uniform. I distinctly recall sneaking green suede boots into my tote bag and then changing them on the bus, I realized the boring uniform didn't have to be boring (of course, I was sent home). Still, minor accessories - pins, headbands, and other goodies can adorn uniforms. The bottom line - uniforms save money for parents and reduce the clothing competition among students.

The dollars saved on clothing, especially for high school students, can be used for after-school programs that include SAT and PSAT tutoring. When researchers look at the achievement gap, they find that White students get more outside help than African American students. This gap explains different college admission rates, different financial aid packages, and different opportunities for internships and other career-enhancing experiences. If there is a choice between clothing and educational supplements, the supplements ought to win hands down.

People in this country use every occasion as a spending opportunity, whether spending is necessary or not. Christmas, Kwanzaa, New Year's Day, Valentine's Day, Mother's Day, Father's Day, and so on, are all occasions to spend money. Have the pencils and pens purchased last year suddenly become obsolete?

I'm not the Grinch who hijacked back to school. I just think parents, especially African American parents, should be wise in the purchases they make. For example, many buy com-

Caught cheating by his wife, comedian Groucho Marx asked, "Who you gonna believe, me or your lying eyes?"

In case after case, when police are caught killing an unarmed African American - and trying to cover it up - they expect us to suspend our sight and our common sense. This is particularly true in the case of 22-year-old Victor White, III in New Iberia, La., about two hours south of his family home of Alexandria, La. and more than two hours west of New Orleans.

Authorities want us to believe that White, who died March 2 in the back seat of a police cruiser, shot himself in the back while his hands were cuffed behind his back. Even the nimblest among us couldn't pull off such an acrobatic feat.

In a press release issued March 3, Louisiana State Police said, "The initial investigation indicates that last night at about 11:22 p.m., deputies with the Iberia Parish Sheriff's Office were responding to the

SOC LOSES SEASON OPENER, 56-34

It was a battle that North Texas football fans are sure to see again in the post season as the defending 5A Division II Champion Cedar Hill Longhorns opened the season to the first among clubs ready to topple the title holders.

During the opening drive Cedar Hill's Justin McMillian, Aca'cedric Ware and DaMarkus Lodge led the Cedar Hill offense 70 yards in a series of small ground gain to draw first blood. In under 7 minutes the Longhorns were up 7-0 and handily controlled the play clock. And the fifteen yard penalty incurred by the Golden Bears didn't hurt either.

But the unfazed SOC answered the Longhorns with an explosive 70 yard jaunt in just under 2 minutes left many sports analysts changing their outlook on the game to come. After two initial runs game up for little or no yardage the Bear's Quarterback David Johnson launched three first down passes--ultimately putting

Two minutes into the second half, TCU pledge J.F. Thomas outran the Cedar Hill secondary for a 59-yard touchdown catch, drawing S.O.C. within a point, 35-34. Thomas finished with 108 yards receiv-

ing and two scores. Much to their chagrin the Bears who were a match for the Longhorns took themselves out of the game with a number of yards given up due to penalties and missed receptions at critical points in the game.

I'm not sure what happened in the locker room during halftime but if couldn't have been good. After the opening reception in the 3rd quarter the Bears failed to put up anymore points in the second half.


Two Left-handers Pose A Doubles Threat

In an all-American mixed doubles match-up, **Taylor Townsend** and **Donald Young** came through with a convincing 7-5, 6-3 win over Jacqueline Cako and Joel Kielbowicz in the first round of the US Open, August 25, 2014, in New York, NY. In their next match, Townsend and Young defeated Andres Hlavackova (CZE) and Alexander Peya (AUT), 6-3, 6-3 to reach the quarterfinals.

Taylor Townsend, born April 16, 1996 in Chicago, IL, started playing tennis right-handed for two years then switched to lefty. In 2012, Taylor won the Australian Open girls' singles championship, and is the first American to hold the No. 1 year-end world ranking for juniors girls since Gretchen Rush in 1982. She turned pro in November 2012, and plays as an aggressive all-court player with a strong forehand, net game, and slice. She has won two ITF Women's singles titles and two doubles. Her career prize money is \$276,027, with a won-loss singles record of 54-31, and a 29-16 record in doubles.

Donald Young, born July 23, 1989 in Chicago, Illinois, plays left-handed. He turned pro in 2004, and is currently ranked the number two male tennis professional in America. He reached the fourth round of the 2011 US Open, which marked his first appearance in the fourth round of a major. His career matches won - 55, lost - 103, and career prize money won - \$1,835,169.






